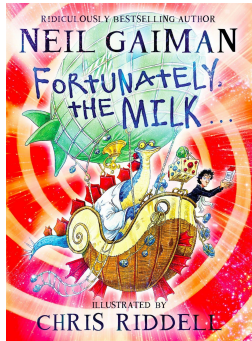


Fortunately, the Milk

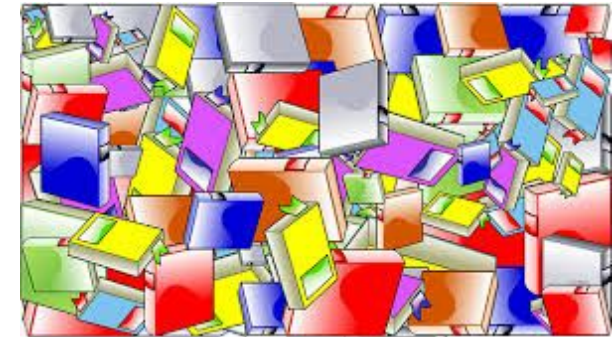
Satch and Me by Dan Gutman

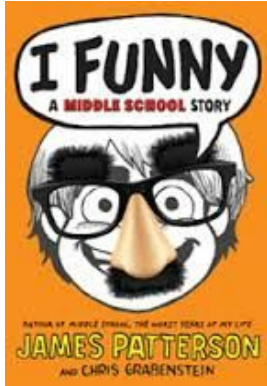

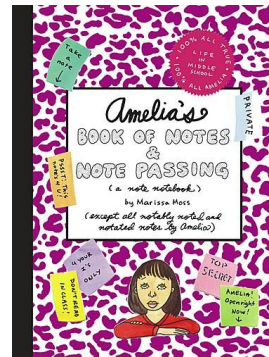

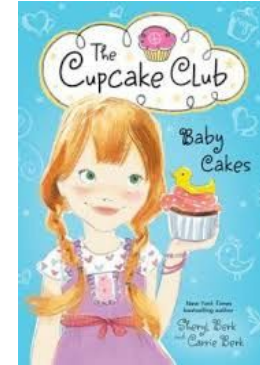


This book is about a new girl, Maxine coming to school. Ever since she arrived, there have been mean notes in Amelia's locker. Amelia is the main character in the book. She gets
